### Reinstatement of Expired Saskatchewan Certificates

For operators applying for certification after allowing their certificates to lapse; lapsed time shall be counted from the date of expiry and not the date of issuance or renewal date.

Note: Past cumulative experience is recognized.

- i. Application can be made for certification at previously held level(s) and area(s).
- ii. As per section 68 of *The Water Regulations, 2002*, one (1) Continuing Education Unit (CEU) is required for renewals falling due after July 15, 2005. In the case where an operators certificate has lapsed for two (2) consecutive renewal periods (four [4] years) the operator must earn two (2) CEUs.
- iii. If an expired Saskatchewan certificate holder is applying to the OCB to have his/her certificate reinstated the operator may apply to the Board under reciprocity if he holds a certificate from another province. In this case, no CEUs would be necessary for renewal of an expired Saskatchewan certificate.
